INFORMATION TO AUTHORS

1. In connection with its publishing activities, it is the policy of the Foundation to own the copyrights and the contributions contained therein in order to protect the interests of the Foundation, its authors and their employers, and at the same time to facilitate the appropriate re-use of this material by others.

2. The United States copyright law requires that the transfer of copyright in each contribution from the author to the Foundation be confirmed in writing. It is therefore necessary that either Part A (Copyright Transfer Form) or Part B (U.S. Government Employee Certification) be executed and returned as promptly as possible.

3. If the author(s) is employed and the paper was prepared as a condition of employment, the rights to the paper initially rest with the employer. In that case, when the author signs the copyright transfer form, it is assumed that he or she is authorized to do so by the employer and that the employer has consented to all the terms and conditions of this form. If not, the form should be signed by someone so authorized.

Note on Returned Rights: Just as the Foundation requires a signed copyright transfer form in order to "do business as usual", it is the intent of this form to return rights to the author and employer so that they, too, may "do business as usual". If further clarification is required, please contact the Director of the Engineering Foundation.

4. For jointly authored papers, only one signature is required, but it is assumed that all authors have been advised and have consented to the terms of this form.

5. Authors who are U.S. government employees are not required to sign the Copyright Transfer form (Part A), but any coauthors outside the Government are.

6. Part B of the form is to be used instead of Part A only if <u>all</u> authors are U.S. Government employees and prepared the paper as part of their job.

7. Authors whose work was performed under a U.S. Government contract but who are not Government employees are required to sign Part A (Copyright Transfer Form). However, item 2E of the form returns reproduction rights to the U.S. Government when required even though the Foundation copyright policy is in effect with respect to the reuse of material by the general public.

PART A - COPYRIGHT TRANSFER FORM

- 3. In the event the aforementioned paper is not accepted and published by the Foundation or is withdrawn by the author(s) before acceptance by the Foundation, this agreement becomes null and void.

Foundation Obligations: In exercising its rights under copyright, the Foundation will make all reasonable efforts to act in the interest of the authors and employers as well as in its own interest. In particular, the Foundation requires that:

- 1. The consent of the first-named author be sought as a condition in granting republication permission to others.
- 2. The consent of the undersigned employer be obtained as a condition in granting permission to others to reuse

or portions of the paper for promotion or marketing purposes.
